Dear Pastors and Praying Friends,

April 13, 2013

Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content. I both know how to be abased, and I know how to abound: everywhere and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and suffer need. I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me. Phil 4:11-13

After sixty-seven meetings, 25 doctor appointments, 27 dental appointments and 36,000 miles in 7 and ½ months it is good to be back in Papua New Guinea. My first Doctors appointment was the day after we arrived in the states and my last was 5 days before we left.

The short end of it:

- *Doing physical therapy on neck and right shoulder*
- *Told not to use a hammer and stop physical labor*
- *Told not to get in any accidents till the neck is strengthened*

So what do I do with in the first 10 days of being back in PNG? Backed into a parked Truck. Yes, it did not feel good. Well physically I have abounded and done a lot in my 50 years. Now how to be abased. My meditation and thoughts on the plane as we crossed the Pacific is how are you going to use me now Lord. It is something we have been praying about and had a few options. After getting back to PNG and talking with some nationals and then Chad Wells it became clear the way to go was to work with Chad Wells in Pangia.

Bro. Chad has a printing press, and other tools to produce, Bibles, Hymn books, tracts and teaching material. Also a Bible Institute, and Ace School. He desperately needs help and I believe this is where the Lord would have us be while I am trying to do my physical therapy, and into the foreseeable future.

I don't have to build a house as his father just left the field a few months ago. It is actually an upgrade from my efforts. Remember I am just a baker. Also to stay in Yaria would be a hindrance to the church we started. We will be about 3 hours from Yaria and will still be able to encourage and strengthen them. Chad and Kirsten (his wife) understand my physical condition and have suggested they can get our supplies to limit my time on the roads. {My physical therapist who supports us said after looking at my neck "it is a miracle you're not crippled"}. Furthermore there are believers near that want someone to come and preach to them and start a church also. May God direct me in that. Meanwhile one of the greatest works going on in PNG right now is the printing press. The material printed will outlast us. This will enable us to get Bibles and other material in the hands of the people. We hope to print 220,000 tracts in the next month which will put us over 1 million tracts. Chad has translated several Chick tracts plus other tracks written in Pidgin. We'll also print out our Bible Institute material in Pidgin for the students to have resources to train their own men. Also for others who live in remote areas. There is a lot for me to learn so please keep this in prayer.

Made a trip to Yaria. Brother Eric Fair drove us (had to be on pain meds). Pastor Bill Pepena and the church is doing well. I am thankful for that. Nek Beli (White Man) died the week we got back and I preached his funeral. He and his wife Maria are the ones that got saved a little over a year ago at our kitchen table before church started one Sunday. Ivan has moved to Mendi and is working for the Catholic Church. Still pray for him to be saved.

Our tent and 40 boxes of books have cleared customs so Chad will be picking that up in a week. Please pray for us as we get settled in. Gwendy, Abigail, Anna and Wesley say good day to all.
