KING JEMS PISIN BIBEL PROJECT

Thank you all for your generous support for the Bible project. Total amount raised is \$126,543.02. (This has happened all since Oct 16th) Of which \$36,567.02 came from churches that support us. Everyone that gave me support for the month of Oct gave to this also. WE DON'T NEED ANY MORE MONEY! Ten thousand Bibles have been ordered already and should be arriving in the Port of Lae in February. Now comes the distribution. After the first container arrives and we know the cost of customs and distribution we will have a second container ordered. A Christian Book Store has already purchased 2000. This will help in distribution. Will keep you updated!!! What is neat is that this is a joint effort from several missionaries here and in the states.

YUNGILI/ KOYA/ LINDE

Since mid Oct. have been very busy working in Yungili with **Bro. Apalia**. We hold services there Sunday morning and evening and Weds night prayer meeting. In addition have gone to the village on Mondays to help Apalia in whatever he may be doing and we always take time for me to read some portions of scripture to him and others who may be around. I even have learned how to weave the pit-pit that makes up the walls of their houses. Weds Apalia and I have gone to two separate villages, **Koya** on one Weds and then **Linde** on the next and so on. Koya is a little ride from Yungili and then an hour walk over a few mountains. The first Weds the whole family went and we had to have a make shift bridge over the creek that had swollen over its banks. Koya is where Apalia's wife is from. Linde is where his dad is from and is just over an hour walk also. He has shown me where his father killed a man and I have learned about his family. His mother was his Dad's 3rd wife of nine. His dad also murdered his mother when Apalia was yet a child. Both Koya and Linde have been receptive to the preaching of the Gospel. Most are Catholic or Lutheran and have lots of questions concerning baptism and Communion as they believe these ordinances will get them into heaven. Last Sunday I started going to Linde after Yungilis morning service. As we arrived Sunday afternoon with the sun beating down on us the Lutherans and Catholics were having a big meeting in the village common area concerning their children. It was like God had gathered them together and I preached over an hour. Please keep all three of these villages in prayer. Pray we have good weather to walk in on Weds and Sundays and any other day we may walk. They are steep walks on clay which can be tough when it has rained. Also on Fridays and or Saturdays I have sat down in the market amongst the people at Yungili and preached the Word of God.

KUDJIP HOUSE SICK

On one of our walks to Linde Apalia and I stopped in to see an Uncle that had gotten sick. His name is Kinde. He looked bad and the Catholics and Pentecostals had come and done their stuff to get him better. After witnessing to him the Lord put it on my heart to take him to Kudjip on Dec 1st. I also decided to take Apalia's daughter. She has been sick and the Doctors at Mendi didn't know what was wrong. Well, Kinde has a disease of the liver and they could just give him medicine to get rid of the water that has been accumulating in his body. Apalia's daughter Doris was diagnosed as having something wrong with her heart. She is about 18 and is saved. There is nothing they can do for her in PNG though. Kinde's family was very happy for the help. Both hospital bills were less than \$50 so it was nothing more than taking my time to help. Please pray for Doris because a woman that can't work isn't cared for much in PNG and no one will want to marry her. It will be a test for Apalia and Lynn (his wife) to care for their daughter. I believe they are up to it.

LITTLE IS MUCH WHEN GOD IS IN IT

It was a tight month yet God was so good to us in unexpected ways. Apalia and Lynn and Dorris (not the daughter but another woman) all showed up one Tuesday and worked in our garden. This cost them a 40cent bus ride (each way). They wanted to show their appreciation for us ministering to them. Nov 28th Gwendy and Vera went to Yungili for a women's Bible Study. I had gone earlier by bus and walked to Linde with Apalia. I had given Gwendy the bus fee for her and Vera, which left us with \$4. Told Gwendy for them to wait for me and when I got back from Linde we would all ride back together. On my way out a man on the bus paid for my fee and told me to keep the \$1.60 change. On the way home a woman paid for Gwendy, Vera and mine and told the ladies to keep the change which Gwendy received, \$1.20. When we got off the bus at Pangia we bought some vegetables for some others we knew had a need. So Dec 1st we left to go to Hagen to get our support money and supplies still with that last \$4. Would have helped if we had a flat tire. Now that may seem little to most but it was a real blessing to me. We haven't missed any meals or anything. Just wanted to share how God looks after us. In fact being a little tight for November kept us being busy with what is free. And that is giving the Word of God to the Lost and strengthening the Brethren. You can do a lot with a 40cent bus ride and a pair of shoes on your feet and a Bible in your hand. So much more but will close for now. Keep looking up for our redemption draweth nigh!!!!
